Uniform pants/shirts must be dark blue and have a natural, not tight, fit. No layering of clothing, such as a uniform shirt under a non-uniform shirt. Any questions please ask your teacher, front desk, or principal. All students must wear well-fitting tennis shoes with socks. <b>NO HOODIES are permitted.</b> For details, please refer to page 13 of the Parent & Student Handbook. For students in grades K-8, no make-up is allowed. For high school students, only light, simple make-up is allowed. No distracting, disruptive or extreme hairstyles, such as Mohawks or etchings, designs, or lettering shaved anywhere on the head/scalp, are allowed. In addition, no distracting or disruptive non-natural hair color is allowed. No visible piercings other than ear lobes are allowed (studs and other jewelry must be removed from other visible piercing locations), and absolutely no gauges are allowed. We recommend that all clothing items are labeled with the Student’s full name (first and last names). T.I.A. will not be responsible for lost/stolen jewelry or other personal items. I understand that Students in grades 4-12 may have 15 minutes of after-school detention on the day of a uniform, make-up, or hair violation. In addition, the student will participate in trash duty, litter pick up, and cleaning walls.

Students may not miss more than 5% of the school year, whether such absences are <b>excused or unexcused</b>. Students not meeting attendance requirements <b>may be subject to retention/ repeating the current grade, failing course grades, and disallowance of graduation (See pg. 9 of the handbook)</b>. <b>Truancy authorities may be notified if a child is habitually truant or has excessive absences. Attendance standards may be changed at any time during the school year as directed/supported by Arizona Dept. of Education, and T.I.A. will communicate any changes to parents.</b></p>

I understand that students in grades 6-12 who are <b>late</b> to school may serve a MANDTORY 15-minute afterschool detention the same day Consistent <b>early pickups</b> may also be given a mandatory 15-minute afterschool detention the following day. <b>In addition, the student will participate in trash duty, litter pick up, and cleaning walls.</b></p>

I will inform my child that all classwork needs to be worked on in class, at home, and completed. In addition, I will provide a place and resources for my child(ren) to use to complete homework <b>DAILY</b>. I will make an effort to provide family structure to complete homework.</p>

T.I.A. will not be responsible for lost/stolen/broken items. Disregard of this rule will result in confiscation of the item in violation of this policy, and the parent will be required to retrieve the electronic item(s) from the principal.</p>

All students <b>must</b> participate unless they have a <b>WRITTEN</b> doctor’s excuse. <b>It is the parents’ responsibility to provide T.I.A. with a doctor’s excuse.</b> All students must wear well-fitting tennis shoes, as part of their uniform. This year, in light of COVID-19, social distancing will be enforced to the extent possible, and T.I.A. will clean and sanitize school areas and equipment frequently.</p>

I understand that <b>NO</b> knives or guns of any kind (real or fake) are allowed on-campus for any reason whatsoever. Notification of police may be required. Possession of weapons will result in student discipline, including expulsion, which may be mandatory under Arizona law.

Possession or use of any of these substances while on campus may result in suspension or exclusion from school. Notification of police may be required.

(See <b>"Volunteering,"</b> below) In addition, parents and other visitors are not allowed to reprimand or speak harshly to any student, staff member and/or other visitors at T.I.A. ## **Consent & Waiver Agreement for Computer Network and Internet Access**

By signing this Consent and Waiver Agreement, my parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and I (the student) state that we have discussed the rights and responsibilities contained herein and I agree to abide by the restrictions contained in this agreement.

The intention of Tucson International Academy is to make the Internet available for the purpose of furthering its educational goals and objectives. Tucson International Academy does not guarantee that pupils will not find some means to access materials not linked with those goals and objectives.

***By signing this agreement all signatories agree that Tucson International Academy shall not be held liable for the use of the computer network and the Internet and that all users will abide by the following terms:***

1. Use of the computer network and the Internet shall be for educational purposes;
2. Use of the computer network and the Internet shall not be for illegal purposes of any kind;
3. The computer network and the Internet shall not be used to transmit threatening, obscene or harassing material in any form;
4. Pupils will not disrupt the computer network and the Internet services by any unauthorized personal action;
5. Pupils will not attempt to gain access or access any computer sites or files for which they do not have authorization;
6. Pupils will not copy information in any form which individuals or organizations hold copyright without specific written permission from those individuals or organizations;
7. Pupils will not engage in game playing on computer networks/computers except when authorized to do so for educational purposes;
8. Pupils will print materials for educational purposes only to authorized printers; and/or
9. Pupils will not engage in other activities that do not advance the educational purposes for which computer networks/computers are provided.

**Individuals violating this policy shall be subject to the consequences and other appropriate discipline which includes but is not limited to:**

- a. **Use of computer networks/computers only under direct supervision;**
- b. **suspension of network privileges;**
- c. **Revocation of network privileges;**
- d. **Suspension of computer privileges;**
- e. **Revocation of computer privileges;**
- f. **Suspension from school;**
- g. **Expulsion from school; and/or**
- h. **Legal action and prosecution by authorities.**

**This next section contains important information regarding the rights of homeless students. Please review!**

**The McKinney Vento Act:  
Parent/Student Rights for Those in Transition**

*The school district shall provide an educational environment that treats all students with dignity and respect. Every homeless student shall have equal access to the same free and appropriate educational opportunities as students who are not homeless. This commitment to the educational rights of homeless children, youth, and youth not living with a parent or guardian, applies to all services, programs, and activities provided or made available.*

A student is considered "homeless" if he or she is presently living:

- In a shelter
- sharing housing with relatives or others due to lack of housing
- in housing without water or electricity.
- in a motel/hotel, camping ground, or similar situation due to lack of alternative, adequate housing
- at a train or bus station, park, or in a car
- in an abandoned building

**All Homeless Students Have Rights To:**

- **Immediate school enrollment.** *A school must immediately enroll students even if they are unable to produce records normally required for enrollment, such as previous academic records, records of immunizations and other required health records, proof of residency, or other documentation; or has missed application or enrollment deadlines during any period of homelessness.*
- **Enroll in:**
  - the school he/she attended when permanently housed (School of Origin)
  - the school in which he/she was last enrolled (School of Origin)
  - The school in the attendance area in which the student currently resides (School of Residency)

\***Receive** a free, appropriate, public education

\***Remain** enrolled in his/her selected school for as long as he/she remains homeless or, if the student becomes permanently housed, until the end of the academic year

\***Priority** in certain preschool programs

\***Participate** in a tutorial-instructional support program, school-related activities, and/or receive other support services comparable to those provided to other students, according to the student's needs

\***Obtain** information regarding how to get fee waivers, free uniforms, and low-cost or free medical referrals

\***Transportation services:** A homeless student attending his/her school of origin has a right to transportation to go to and from the school of origin as long as (s) he is homeless or, or if the student becomes permanently housed, until the end of the academic year if requested.

**Dispute Resolution:** If you disagree with school officials about enrollment, transportation or fair treatment of a homeless child or youth, contact the school district. The school district must respond and attempt to resolve it quickly. During the dispute, the student

must be immediately enrolled in the school and provided transportation until the matter is resolved. Tucson International Academy has a Homeless Education Program Liaison who will assist you in making enrollment and placement decisions. The TIA Liaison is Miss Jeannette Cannon.
